STANDING ORDER REQUIRING THE FILING OF COURTESY COPIES WITH CHAMBERS OF ALL MOTION PAPERS FILED (ELECTRONICALLY OR OTHERWISE) IN CIVIL AND CRIMINAL CASES ASSIGNED TO JUDGE McMAHON

McMahon, J.:

Whenever a party files a motion in a case assigned to Judge McMahon, courtesy copies of the moving papers MUST be delivered to Chambers by the business day after the motion is filed. Courtesy copies of papers opposing a motion and reply papers supporting the motion must likewise be delivered to Chambers by the business day after they are filed. That is, if your motion is filed on Monday, courtesy copies must be delivered to Chambers by the close of business on Tuesday.

If your motion requires urgent attention, you should arrange to have a copy delivered to Chambers the <u>same</u> day it is filed. Judge McMahon uses the courtesy copies—not ECF—to control her motion docket. If you do not send the courtesy copies, disposition of your motion may be delayed.
